1. Cooks Creek Conservation Plan – Stream Corridor Assessments

- a. Travis has narrowed down the scope of the properties
- 2. Litter Prevention
 - a. PennDOT will put up some signs for the litter corridor at their expense
 - i. Five preliminary locations were selected

3. E-waste Recycling

- a. The county's e-waste grant funds for last year's event have been paid out to the township
- b. Kim will track the items coming in that would be recycled at a fee so we do not go over the maximum grant fund allotment

4. Recycling

- a. Lorna attended and reported on the program presented by the county on recycling
 - i. Glass is hard to recycle properly
 - ii. Numbers 1, 2 and 5 are the only plastics currently being recycled by haulers in the county
 - iii. Waste Management reported that 60% of the recycling they take in is trashed because it is unusable
 - iv. NJ is considering policy at the state level to create a standard for recycling
 - v. Plastic bags returned to grocery stores *are* typically recycled into Trex if taken back to the grocery stores
 - vi. Due to the issues with the recycling, Waste Management is starting to recycle things from the waste stream themselves
 - vii. Aluminum remains a high value recyclable commodity
