Points of Interest from Springfield PD

- 1) 12/04/2024 STPD participated in the Upper Bucks Crime Meeting. This was a great opportunity to share information with other agencies in an in-person, face-to-face setting. We actually gained some valuable intelligence information that kicked off a narcotics investigation and partnership with the Bucks County Drug Task Force. We also gained valuable information regarding a potentially volatile living arrangement of subjects renting an apartment in Springfield Township. While these situations may lead to arrests or just officer safety information, it is arguably just as important to serving as a key component to maintaining the quality of life of all of our residents, which is what the PD is tasked with in an ongoing way.
- 2) 12/10/2024 Chief completed Security Awareness Training for the Commonwealth Law Enforcement Assistance Network (CLEAN), which is a network of Local, State, Federal, and International criminal information databases of which is highly secure. This Security Awareness Training is a training/test that is taken every year in order to maintain security clearances and awareness of general updates and new capabilities of the Network. In January 2025, the PA State Police will be conducting an onsite audit of our system securities, lookups, policies, and documentation/tracking of all intelligence information and data received through the CLEAN system.
- 3) 12/12/2024 I hope our PD's ugly sweaters were received with laughter and joy during the holiday luncheon. Thank you Lisa and all who helped put it together. It was a blast.
- 4) 12/12/2024 Quakertown's 14th Annual Shop with a Cop kicked off around 5:00 at the Walmart in Quakertown. This is just such a great event and a wonderful way to bring smiles to a ton of children's faces in the Quakertown/Palisades School District area. The staggering statistics of this event are over 90 Law Enforcement Officers helping over 400 children and their families. It is a long, and tiring event (not to mention HOT).....but well worth it for sure!!!
- 5) 12/12/2024 All Officer's Municipal Police Officers Education and Training Commission (MPOETC) certifications were verified for the 2024 Calander year as required by the Commission in December of each year.
- 6) 12/13/2024 House Bill 700 (signed into law in July of 2024) requires all School Districts in the state of Pennsylvania to have at least one full-time security personnel on duty each school day. Palisades School District hired Cardinal Point Security Group to handle this task. Doug Rex (retired PA State Trooper) was assigned to Palisades School District (other substitutes will be available when Mr. Rex is not) and started on December 09, 2024. Luckily for us, our Officers and myself are already familiar with Mr. Rex as he was have worked with him when he was assigned to the Vice/Narcotics Investigation Squad for Troop M, as well as the when he was the liaison for the FBI's Violent Gang Task Force. Mr. Rex is an extremely qualified individual for this position at the School District and we look forward to working with him in an ongoing manner to keep our children safe and secure in and out of the walls and halls of the schools.
